Our records indicate you have failed to pay your court ordered fine. A \$300.00 civil assessment, pursuant to Penal Code 1214.1, is pending on your case.

You must do one of the following within 20 days of June 06, 2022:

1. Pay the reduced amount of \$855.00 in full. To close your case through the mail, send a check or money order to the address indicated above. Postmarks are not accepted. To pay with a credit card, you may access your case online at <https://services.saccourt.ca.gov/PublicCaseAccess/Traffic>.

OR

2. Appear in court. You have the option to appear in person or by video conference via Zoom. Assistance is available Monday – Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Hearings are held on Wednesday at 3:00 p.m. To request a hearing choose one of the options below:
 - a. Appear at the Carol Miller Justice Center Room 100.
 - b. Speak with a clerk at the Virtual Public Counter via Zoom on a device with audio and video capabilities. Using the camera or QR code reader on your device, scan this QR code or enter the meeting ID 160 5330 6751 in the Zoom application to enter the virtual waiting room.



At the hearing, you may request community service in lieu of paying the fine if it was not previously ordered on the case. There are a variety of service assignments available for all education levels and physical limitations. Flexible schedules and hours may also be available.

If you fail to comply within 20 days, the court will impose the full civil assessment penalty and the amount of \$1,005.00 will become due. Pursuant to Vehicle Code 40509.5, the amount due will be forwarded to an outside collection agency. You will no longer be able to appear in court to discuss your case.
