

NOTICE TO DEFENDANT/PROOF OF SERVICE

NOTICE TO DEFENDANT

This notice is to advise you that charges against you have been filed with the court as a result of a violation of a law (or laws) of the State of California. This matter is now under the jurisdiction of the court. **Please do not communicate with the California Highway Patrol except to obtain proof of correction if required by the Notice to Appear.** Your copy of the Notice to Appear will provide you the information relative to the proper court response. **FAILURE TO APPEAR MAY RESULT IN PRECLUSION OF RENEWAL OF REGISTRATION FOR THE VEHICLE INVOLVED OR ISSUANCE OF A WARRANT OF ARREST.**

If you have been given a court date/time	It is your responsibility to contact that court no later than the date/time indicated.
If the box marked "To Be Notified" is checked	You can expect to receive a notice from the court with all necessary information. If you do not receive a notice, contact the court.
If you are under the age of 18 and you are directed to contact the juvenile authority	You must be accompanied by a parent or guardian when you report to the juvenile court.

CODEFENDANT INFORMATION

As the owner or lessee, the person employing, requesting, causing, directing, or permitting a driver to operate the vehicle(s) described in the Notice to Appear, you should know that California Vehicle Code Section 40001(f) as quoted below, is the only process available to make the driver or other person a codefendant in this matter.

CALIFORNIA VEHICLE CODE SECTION 40001(f)

Whenever the owner, or lessee, or any other person is prosecuted for a violation pursuant to this section, the court may, on the request of the defendant, take appropriate steps to make the driver of the vehicle, or any other person who directs the loading, maintenance, or operation of the vehicle, a codefendant. However, the court may make the driver a codefendant only if the driver is the owner or lessee of the vehicle, or the driver is an employee, or a contractor of the defendant who requested the court to make the driver a codefendant. If the codefendant is held solely responsible and found guilty, the court may dismiss the charge against the defendant.


